Hammad Zaidi is passionately committed to UCLA and supporting Bruin student-athletes through the Wooden Athletic Fund. Hammad is a 1994 UCLA graduate, earning his MFA in Film and TV from the UCLA School of Theater, Film and TV. Even though he grew up in Kansas, Hammad became a UCLA fan early in life—while in kindergarten—when he found a UCLA beanie in the snow. The beanie may have made him cognizant of UCLA, but when he started watching basketball games coached by John Wooden, he was smitten. Being accepted into UCLA's graduate program was one of the high points in his life, equal only to his future wife Shahina accepting his marriage proposal and when he became a father to their twin daughters, Lena and Zoe, now 6 years old.

Upon his graduation from UCLA, Hammad founded Lonely Seal Releasing, an international distribution and production company. In 2002, while producing a national public service announcement, endorsed by the White House for the one-year anniversary of 9/11, he found himself scouring New Jersey for a location and getting nowhere. He was saved by a Bruin alum who noticed his UCLA shirt and class ring and—for that reason alone—allowed him to use her home for the shoot. Hammad came to the realization that being a Bruin was more than a common bond; it was a way of life.

Hammad became a member of the Wooden Athletic Fund soon after forming his company in 1997 and contributed to the Pauley Pavilion Renovation Project with a Leadership Gift in 2010. He and Shahina have since upgraded their WAF giving two levels to where they are now members at the Coaches Roundtable level.

"I have a deep respect for student-athletes, especially those who attend an academically challenging institution like UCLA, and I'm proud to be able to help nurture their growth as academically gifted students and physically gifted athletes. I give to the Wooden Athletic Fund because John Wooden's teachings have always inspired me to strive to be the best person I can be, while I constantly test the limits of what I can achieve."

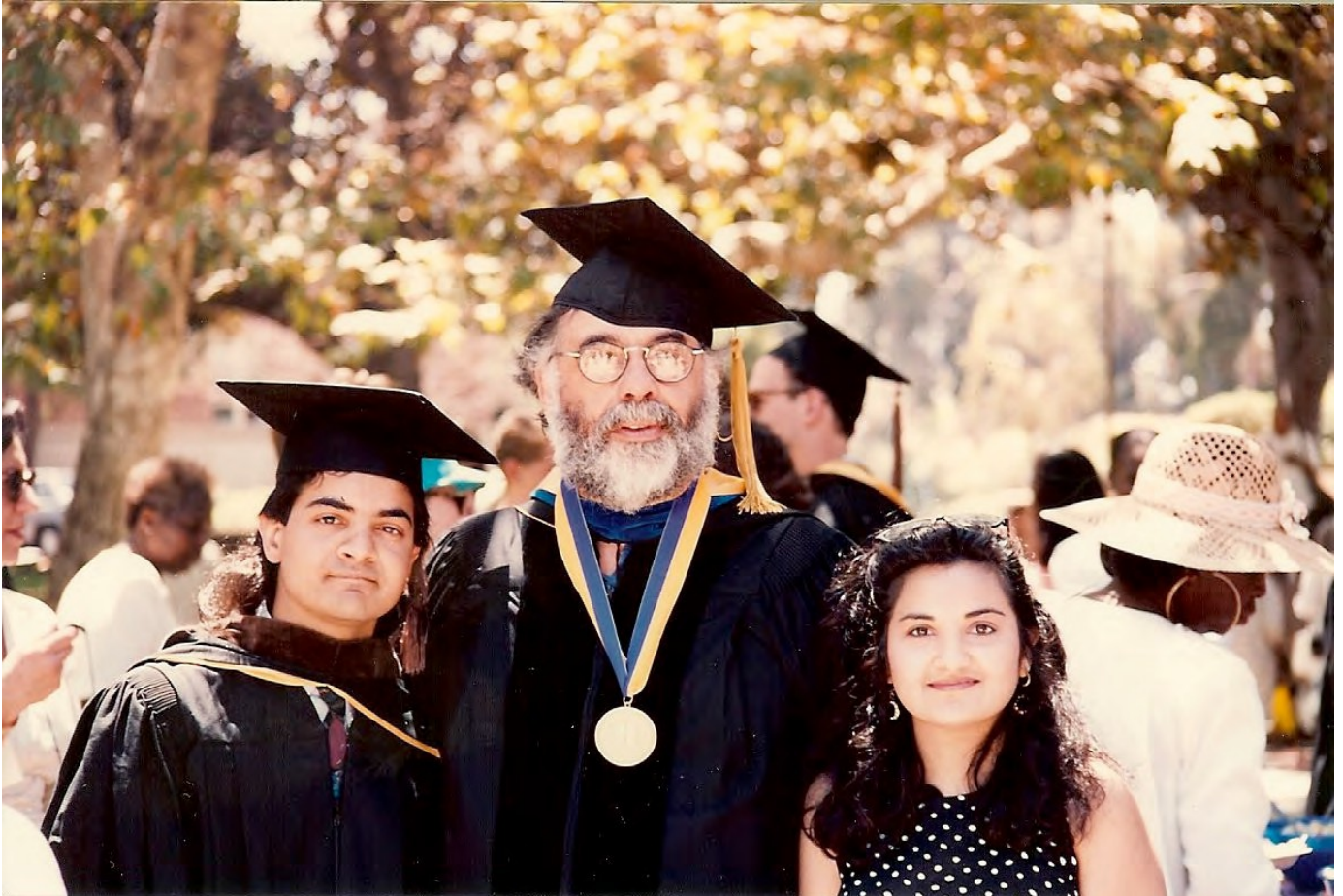

Written, directed, and produced a national PSA for the first anniversary of September 11.

Produced by Hammad Zaidi's Lonely Seal Pictures for the Champions of Hope Foundation.

The White House-endorsed piece was released theatrically by Regent Cinemas on 5,001 screens, and broadcast on major television networks. It was also screened at major arenas, like the Staples Center in Los Angeles and the Pepsi Center in Denver.

Access

Script Accessible is a screenwriting contest that endorses screenwriters with disabilities and stories about disabled characters. It began as a partnership with Slamdance and continued at the Lonely Seal Festival.
